It's with Joy in my heart that I thank all parents, children and staff of St John's School for your kind donation £205.15 for COPs (Care of Police Survivors Charity). This is a charity set up to help families who have lost a loved one on duty in the Police Force.

On 21st June at 7pm a group of us set off, climbing Loughrigg Fell in the Lake District. It was a tough

climb. The aches and pains were eased when I recalled that you wonderful people had donated in the region of £200. I had a timely message from school on the day of the walk giving me this information, and it was such an encouragement during the climb. Once on the peak, we wild camped until 3am, at which time we lit flares in memory of lost colleagues, family and friends. This happened on all the Peaks in the Lake District (Police colleagues from other Forces on other peaks). It was such an emotional moment.






As the sun rose, we came down off the mountain top, a slippery journey due to the heavy rain, but this didn't take away the emotion of the night and your generous donation.
