 Understanding The World Pupils will be able to: Know there are different countries in the world and talk about the differences they have experienced or seen in photos. 	 Personal Social Emotional Development Pupils will be able to: Play with one or more other children, extending and elaborating play ideas. Talk about their feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried'. Be increasingly independent in meeting their own care needs, e.g. brushing teeth, using the toilet. 	 Expressive Arts and Design Pupils will be able to: Begin to develop complex stories using small world equipment like animal sets, dolls and dolls houses. Draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details. Sing the pitch of a tune sung by another person ('pitch match').
