Are you Eligible for Free School Meals?

Parents claiming some benefits can claim free school meals for any of their children who are registered at a Staffordshire school and who would normally be at school at lunch time. School meals are a good way to ensure that your child eats well at lunchtime and you can save yourself time and money.

Even if you don't want your children to have the meals, claiming them helps their school. The more eligible parents who claim meals, the more funding the school receives.

In Staffordshire, HAF (Holiday Activities and Food) funding is available for children and young people aged 5-16 who meet specific criteria. Primarily, this includes those who receive benefits-related free school meals. Additionally, children under care order at home, young carers, fostered children, and children on a placement order, as determined by <u>Staffordshire County Council</u>, may also be eligible.

A taste of what we've been up to over the final half term:

EYFS

Early years had a great time learning about superheroes. Laurie the nurse came in to talk about her role and Lynn the post lady discussed her role within the community. We also had a visit from a real policeman who



showed us how to take fingerprints!







Reception Class children took part in a sunflower growing competition organised by Leek Rotary Club. Each child planted a sunflower seed then took it home and nurtured it for a few months and the children were amazed to see how the different conditions had affected how the plants grew.

With many of the sunflowers growing taller than the children, Charlotte's was the runner up and Ezra's was the winning sunflower measuring 178cm tall. Well done all!





Year 1:

As part of their science topic on plants, Year 1 planted some sunflower seeds and closely observed how they grew.

The children were thrilled to receive a very special letter—from none other than Jack, from Jack and the Beanstalk! Jack asked the children for advice on what to do with his magic beans. Using everything they had learned about how plants grow and writing instructions in English, the children worked together to write clear, helpful instructions for Jack to follow. Jack was so grateful for their expert advice that he followed their instructions exactly.

Year 1 have been learning how to find a quarter of different objects and shapes in Maths. Taking their learning outside, the children used chalk to draw a variety of shapes and discovered lots of creative ways to split them into quarters. They had a fantastic time learning in the fresh air and showed great understanding—everyone was able to find a quarter!

Year 2

Year 2 visited Whitfield Valley Nature Reserve to investigate microhabitats. The children enjoyed finding minibeasts in the pond and grassland habitats as well as making journey sticks to take home as a reminder of the day.







Year 2 have been working hard with Miss Richardson making pouches for their Design and Technology. They used templates to carefully cut the material, then they used running stitch to join their fabric, creating a pouch. Finally they added their decorations.

Their resilience, perseverance and independence certainly paid off as the pouches they created look amazing!

Year 3 created some fantastic Egyptian collars during their Design and Technology lessons. They designed their collars and then used running stitch, cross stitch and

appliqué to complete some fabulous collars.




Activities to keep you entertained over the summer holidays:
